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La Rosière, the mountain between France and Italy

On a natural balcony overlooking the valley, La Rosière offers a panoramic view of the Haute Tarentaise and opens towards Italy, accessible in just a few minutes via the Col du Petit Saint-Bernard. An authentic mountain destination founded in 1960 by shepherds, La Rosière offers 15,000 tourist beds while preserving its family spirit. Here, the mountain is fully alive in summer: hiking, road cycling, mountain biking, relaxation, or camping. The altitude guarantees an ideal climate: sunny days without excessive heat, cool and restful nights. Mindful of its identity, the resort ensures its Savoyard charm through a local urban plan requiring the use of traditional materials such as wood, stone, and slate.



The Italian border can be reached in 10 minutes via the Col du Petit Saint-Bernard, either by car or by shuttle bus. A further 20-minute drive takes you to La Thuile, the gateway to the Val d'Aoste and its many attractions.

AMONG THE HIGHLIGHTS NOT TO BE MISSED

The Ruitor Waterfalls: 3 waterfalls to discover during a 2-3 hour walk, accessible to all. A refreshing moment with a breathtaking view of the Val d'Aoste.

SkyWay Monte Bianco: In Courmayeur, this giant cable car propels you in minutes to 3,466 metres above sea level at the summit of the Hellbronner peak, at the foot of the Italian side of Mont Blanc, between the Grande Dame and the Dent du Géant. On-site, dining and museum spaces.

The Thermes de Pré Saint Didier: 4,000 m² of relaxation spaces, hot water pools, and treatments for a wellness break at the foot of Mont Blanc. The QC Termemontebianco hotel extends the experience with high-end services dedicated to regeneration. Shuttles are available from La Rosière.

Between France and Italy, La Rosière promises a summer of grandeur in nature, where escape is always within reach.



HISTORY AND HERITAGE

La Rosière and its surroundings are home to true historical treasures, witnesses to military epics and tales of pilgrims from the past.

THE PETIT ST-BERNARD PASS: between nature, history, and memory

A natural border between France and Italy, the Petit Saint-Bernard Pass is an emblematic site marked by centuries of exchange and key historical events. In March 1945, it was the scene of a fierce battle where soldiers of the 13th Battalion of Alpine Chasseurs wrested this strategic position from the Germans after a week of fighting under extreme conditions.

A documentary by Serge Tignères, filmed onsite with the participation of today's alpine hunters, recounts this little-known episode of the Liberation

Today, the pass remains a must-see, combining history and nature: the Hospice du Petit-Saint-Bernard, founded in 1050 by Saint Bernard de Menthon. Former mountain refuge; it is now an



inn-restaurant, a museum, and an information point, ideal for a gourmet break or a night in the mountains (30 beds available from June to November). Nearby, the Chanousia, an alpine garden created by Abbé Pierre Chanoux in the 19th century, reveals 1,000 varieties of mountain plants, a botanical haven to explore in summer.

THE FORT OF LA REDOUTE RUINÉE



Perched at 2,400 metres above sea level, the Fort de la Redoute Ruinée dominates the Col de la Traversette and offers an exceptional panorama of Mont Blanc and the Petit Saint-Bernard Pass. This emblematic site of World War II, once strategic, is now frozen in time. To preserve its remains, visits are exclusively from the outside, accessible on foot or by bike for total immersion in history and the surrounding nature.

Help Papi Pierre regain his memory! La Rosière offers holidaymakers a life-size investigation game, combining history and adventure. From the top of the Roches Noires chairlift to the Fort de la Redoute Ruinée, holidaymakers will discover memory boxes, collecting clues along the way to Papi Pierre's treasure chest. With the free investigation booklet available at the Tourist Office, the inspector solves the puzzles and learns all about the history of La Rosière, from the 1900s to the first ski lifts, including the two world wars. An activity accessible to all for a day with friends or family.



THE VILLAGES



Located in the Haute Tarentaise, the commune of Montvalezan extends over a vast mountain territory and includes 44 hamlets. Its main town, a former centre of life, houses a vicarial tower listed as a Historic Monument and a 17th-century church. The traditional architecture, characterised by stone, wood, and slate, adapts to mountain conditions. The commune also has a rich religious heritage with 14 chapels, restored over time. Among them, the Chapelle du Châtelard, perched on a promontory, houses the oldest bell in Montvalezan, cast in 1559.

PASTORAL ACTIVITY

The alpine pastures of Montvalezan, shaped by a long pastoral tradition, bear witness to the agricultural history of the commune. Once essential for subsistence, farming has evolved, with only about a dozen farmers remaining today. The Tarine cow, emblematic of the region, provides the milk used to make Beaufort, recognised by a protected designation of origin. In addition to its economic role, agriculture contributes to the preservation of landscapes and the environment. Several local producers perpetuate this know-how and offer cheeses and regional products, available at the farm or in shops.

DON'T MISS OUT

Aux Délices Fermiers: In the Eucherts district, Odile Villiod offers cheeses and regional products from her goat farm in La Rochette.

La Bergerie du Genièvre: Sheep's milk cheeses and yoghurts, including Camillou, a delicious fresh cheese. Visits by appointment (Stéphane Gaide: +33 (0)6 23824255).

Beaufort Cooperative: In Bourg-Saint-Maurice, a free, self-guided tour allows visitors to discover the production of Beaufort. Sales point in La Rosière.



THE FÊTE DES CLARINES

MAJOR EVENT

On August 2nd and 3rd, La Rosière celebrates its four-legged emblem with an elegance contest dedicated to the majestic Saint Bernard dogs. A highlight of the Fête des Clarines, this event showcases these faithful mountain companions, symbols of the resort. Throughout the weekend, Savoyard tradition is in the spotlight: an open-air ball on Saturday evening, a parade of floats, folkloric shows, and exhibitions on Sunday. Sports enthusiasts can also take on the challenge of the Sunday morning cycling climb. Between culture, terroir, and conviviality, the Fête des Clarines promises a festive immersion in the heart of Alpine heritage.

TRUE NATURE

At La Rosière, you feel fully immersed in nature. Here, the mid-mountain offers a peaceful atmosphere, lulled by the murmur of numerous streams, while the surrounding peaks draw a breathtaking high-mountain landscape.

HIKING

Walking – it's healthy and it's free. With about twenty marked hiking trails of all difficulties on the French side and as many in Italy, La Rosière will delight hiking enthusiasts:

The most accessible: Le Chemin du Vaz

Ideal for a family outing, this trail follows a stream from Le Châtelard and leads to a picnic area 40 minutes in, nestled in the heart of the alpine chalets. An easy route, perfect for a nature break.

The wildest: La Louie Blanche via Lac du Retour

An exceptional route for experienced hikers with 1,000 metres of elevation gain. Between forests, rocks, and high-altitude lakes, this loop crosses raw and preserved landscapes, offering a true immersion in the mountains for about 5 hours.

The highest: The summit of Lancebranlette (2,936 m)

An accessible challenge with 800 metres of elevation gain. In less than 3 hours of ascent, you reach a summit with a 360° view of Mont Blanc and the surrounding massifs. At sunrise or sunset, marmots and ibex are often present. Hiking is not reserved only for elevation enthusiasts. To admire the summits more peacefully, the Roches Noires and Eucherts chairlifts are open throughout the season. The round trip is \le 9 for an adult, \ge 7 for those under 13, or included in the Activ'été cards. Click to discover the hiking map.

HIGH-ALTITUDE REFUGES: trekking in the heart of the Alps

At La Rosière, the adventure doesn't stop at day hikes. Trekking enthusiasts can set off on magnificent refuge-to-refuge routes in the heart of preserved nature.


From La Rosière, it is possible to reach the Ruitor refuge via Lac du Retour. A demanding 13.7 km route with 910 metres of elevation gain. After a night in the mountains, the adventure can continue towards the Archeboc refuge, a 3.5-hour stage accessible to experienced hikers.

For a cross-border getaway, head to La Thuile with the shuttle bus. The ascent to the Deffeyes refuge, via the impressive Ruitor waterfalls, is 980 metres of elevation gain, followed by a night perched in a magnificent setting. At dawn, the spectacle of Lago dei Seracchi launches the final day: a sporty return to France via Laghi di Bellacomba and the Col de la Louie Blanche. A challenging 16 km route with 560 metres of ascent and 1,210 metres of descent, reserved for experienced hikers.




An immersive journey between glacial lakes, panoramic ridges, and high-altitude trails for a timeless adventure at the rhythm of the mountains.

AND FOR THOSE WHO WANT TO RUN?



For experienced walkers seeking new challenges, La Rosière is a true playground for trail runners. From the peaceful Chemin des Myrtilles winding through the forest to the formidable Sentier des Chasseurs with its 1,100 metres of elevation gain, immersion in nature is guaranteed. Professional athletes Arthur Joyeux-Bouillon (7th in UTMB) and Marie Goncalves (1st in SaintéLyon) use La Rosière's trails as their training ground. Want to give it a try? Trail initiations are offered every Monday to get started with confidence.

Every summer, and for the eleventh time this year, the Trail de La Rosière association attracts passionate runners, whether beginners or professionals, to explore La Rosière's trails during a festive day.



Three races are offered: 15 km (800 m D+), 22 km (1,450 m D+), and the main event of 40 km (3,000 m D+). With views of the Petit Saint-Bernard Pass and Mont Blanc, this aerial and demanding trail attracts a full house every year. While the runners give their best on the trails, families and supporters enjoy the village set up for the occasion on the Place des Eucherts: entertainment, refreshments, food, partner stands, and fireworks.

LA ROSIÈRE AND TWO WHEELS

MY FIRST MOUTAIN PASS

At La Rosière, cyclists find an ideal playground with varied routes and challenges suitable for the greatest riders. Among the must-do routes, the ascent of the mythical Petit Saint-Bernard Pass, used by the Tour de France in 2018, offers 24 km of climbing with 1,288 metres of elevation gain, including a passage on the famous pink road with a 13% gradient and an arrival at the Italian border, offering a breathtaking view of Mont Blanc. Amateur challengers can also tackle the Cormet de Roselend, connecting the Beaufortain over 20.3 km and 1,245 metres of elevation gain, or the formidable Col de l'Iseran, culminating at 2,764 metres after 47.4 km of effort. To fully enjoy these routes, La Rosière's sports shops offer a wide range of equipment, from classic road bikes to electric mountain bikes, with flexible rental options and maintenance services. Some accommodations are also equipped to securely store bikes, ensuring a comfortable stay for cyclists.



THE BIKE PARK



Thanks to the ski lifts or your own leg power, you can gain altitude and set off on a mountain bike through shaped trails and steep paths. Downhill and Enduro enthusiasts will not be disappointed; the La Rosière Bike Park offers 3 downhill trails and 6 Enduro and eBike circuits with up to 1,200 metres of elevation gain. The Roches Noires and Eucherts chairlifts are open in summer to allow downhill riders to reach the trails. Open from June 28 to September 5th 2025. Ski lift passes starting at €21.50 for an adult day.

A ski patroller in winter and a bike patrol in summer, David is a true architect of La Rosière's trails. Between snow and earth, rescue and shaping, he lives the mountain to the fullest.

In summer, he sculpts the bike park's trails, optimises the modules, and ensures the safety of riders. «Seeing the trails evolve and the riders having fun is ultra-motivating!» he confides. With a unique perspective on the behind-the-scenes of skiing and mountain biking, he embodies these behind-the-scenes jobs that make the resorts vibrate. A captivating dual identity waiting to be explored.



NEW CROSS-BORDER MTB TRAIL

UNMISSABLE



It is now possible to reach La Thuile via marked MTB trails thanks to the new Interreg connection. The cross-border trail is a 43 km round trip with 1,154 metres of elevation gain. It is entirely possible to go to La Thuile by MTB and return by shuttle. Between cultural heritage and endless valleys, this new trail promises a discovery of new landscapes even for those most familiar with La Rosière.

LAST MAN RIDING MAJOR EVENT

After a successful first edition last summer, the Last Man Riding returns to La Rosière on July 5th 2025. Created by professional cyclist Loïc Péché, the concept is simple: riders must complete a 15.7 km / 392 m D+ loop through La Rosière. The first start is at 10 am, the second at 11 am, the third at noon, etc.

LE TROPHÉE DES RUELLES: Sunday, 10 August



Every summer, this unique duo MTB race combines technique and endurance. In pairs, participants have 45 minutes to complete as many laps as possible on a one-kilometre circuit specially designed for the event. Between forest slalom, stair climbing, and balance challenges, this event, organised in partnership with Evolution 2, guarantees thrills and a friendly atmosphere in the heart of La Rosière's streets.

ACTIVITIES WITH A VIEW

CLIMBING



The village of Châtelard, 6 km from La Rosière, is known for its Chapelle Saint-Michel but also houses the Versondane rock where you can learn or improve your outdoor climbing skills: 16 routes from 4A to 6A. The Jean Arpin Hall in the centre of La Rosière also has an indoor climbing wall with 15 routes and 2 automatic belays. Introductory sessions are available.

A NIGHT SUSPENDED IN THE VOID? Have no fear

UNMISSABLE

This year, the Bureau des Guides offers a unique experience: spending the night on a portaledge suspended on a cliff face, after enjoying an aperitif while watching the sunset. A timeless night lulled by the silence of the mountain. Accessible to all from 8 years old, no climbing experience required. For a gentler discovery, it is also possible to enjoy only the aperitif at altitude and admire the valley from the heights for two hours at dusk.

OPEN-AIR CINEMA NEW

This summer, La Rosière offers, for the first time, two open-air cinema screenings per week. Installed in front of the screen, the audience can enjoy projections in a natural setting, under the starry sky of the mountains. An opportunity to escape for an evening and enjoy a moment of relaxation in nature, in a peaceful and friendly atmosphere.



As part of its drive to offer a wide range of activities in both summer and winter, La Rosière Ski Resort is inviting thrill-seekers to discover Gravity Kart. After a chairlift ride from Eucherts, it's time for a unique descent in a three-wheeled, motorless kart, close to the ground. A simple turn of the wheel and you're off for 3 kilometres of dedicated track, between grassy slopes and raised turns.

Accessible from 1.25 m, this activity can be practised at your own pace: gently to enjoy the scenery or at full speed for an adrenaline rush. Price: from €25 per descent (kart, helmet, and lift included). Info at larosiere.net

EUROPE'S HIGHEST 9-HOLE GOLF COURSE

Located at 2,000 metres above sea level and overlooking the Haute Tarentaise Valley, La Rosière Golf Course offers a 9-hole, par-27 course in a grandiose panoramic setting in the heart of the Alps. Set on natural terrain, the course follows the reliefs, winding through the alpine pasture over nearly 10 hectares. With a brand-new covered driving range, the view with every ball strike is breathtaking. Nearby, the PARADiS restaurant houses the clubhouse and offers refreshments for golfers and walkers. Open from 21 June to 7 September 2025, from 9:30 am to 6 pm. Green fee from €35, bucket of balls from €3.50.

CHILDREN BETWEEN SPORT AND NATURE

La Rosière is labelled FAMILLE PLUS. Welcoming families is a philosophy here. Large families, single-parent families, families with young children or teenagers, all are welcome. The very construction of the resort and the range of services and activities offered guarantee ideal and stress-free holidays for all families.

Between Evolution2 and the ESF's Club des Galopins, parents can entrust their children to teams of qualified and highly motivated animators, from half a day to several days. Children alternate between sports activities (archery, orienteering, mountain biking, rafting) and discovery activities (nature hikes, arts and crafts, camping...). An ideal way to leave your child in good hands for a sporty day with your partner on the mountain hiking or mountain biking trails.



LES P'TITS RANDONNEURS



To encourage children to go hiking, La Rosière has launched the "Little Hikers" programme – and it's a hit every year! Parents can buy their child a "Little Hikers" bandana (€5 at the Tourist Office), then take them out on the hiking trails. At the end of the walk, it's time for a selfie for everyone, then back to the Tourist Office to show proof of completion and exchange it for the badge corresponding to the hike. Around fifteen different badges can be collected to earn the bronze, silver, and gold Mountains.

LE PLAN DE L'ARC

Le Plan de l'Arc and its Lac du Repos offer a beautiful natural setting for relaxing and enjoying outdoor activities. Designed with everyone's comfort in mind, the area is equipped with picnic tables, free-to-use barbecues, and deckchairs that invite you to unwind. For leisure, there's a city park, a brand-new pump track, a climbing boulder, a ping-pong table, swings, and a pétanque court – providing plenty of fun for families and friends alike. It's the perfect spot to combine relaxation and activity in a peaceful mountain environment.



LE THÉÂTRE FORESTIER



An open-air performance venue that blends perfectly into its natural surroundings – yes, it's possible. The Forest Theatre of La Rosière was built right in the heart of the Forest Trail, which links the resort's two main areas, without cutting down a single tree. It's made entirely from larch, a durable local wood, with no concrete used at all. Even the foundations are wooden, anchored several metres deep into the ground. Fully accessible, it can host up to 150 people and offers a varied programme: concerts, weekly Tuesday shows, open-air cinema... You can even get married there!

Bourg-Saint-Maurice TGV station: 23 km (TGV-Thalys). Via Italy, through the Mont Blanc Tunnel and Courmayeur. In Pré Saint Didier, follow La Thuile, then the Petit Saint-Bernard Pass.
